

Brethren,

We had a wonderful visitation on 10/15 with Live Oak Lodge. MW John Cooper III gave an informative presentation on Thomas Starr King. Worshipful Gary Peare contributed with his experience regarding the return of Thomas Starr King's statue to California.

MW Cooper gave us a varied history lesson dating back to the 1700's and including the Presidential election of 1824 that involved two Grand Masters Andrew Jackson and Henry Clay.

Thomas Starr King was the Grand Orator for the California Grand Lodge.

Following is a portion of his Grand Oration from 1863 which MW Cooper discussed.

"Whatever will teach our people reverence, decorum and respect for others, in the utterance and defense of opinion, submission to constituted authority, with dignity and grace, will be medicine for our trouble, and will prepare us for a better future. I believe that the Order of Masonry, the quiet efficiency of its organism and the regard for forms it fosters, the love of order it induces and deepens, the graceful habits of submission it educates, and the sacredness it pours around organic law and the seats of authority, are a prominent portion of the bonds of civilization in our country, and an immense blessing when you consider our perils.

How good and how precious it is for brethren to dwell in such unity. May it continue brothers and widen through our fidelity and service and beneficence. God preserve our organization and guard our Order, inspire our beneficence, and grant that a century hence, our successors may meet here to enjoy in a larger fellowship, the result of our faithfulness, and within a nation not sundered, but presided over by one Grand Master, heir of the virtues, the hope and the blessing of (George) Washington."

Wonderful thoughts and words we must still live by as Masons.

White Pony Express assembled some more "food kits" for its Blessings Project, which is designed to help recently immigrated Latinx families who are particularly vulnerable at this time. One of the volunteers helping on Sept. 8 was Katie Pintado, who is the building manager of the Orinda Masonic Lodge.

WPE's idea is to deliver food and spices that are familiar to Latinx neighbors. The food kits include fresh produce, rice, Masa flour, beans, tomato sauce, cheese, assorted peppers, an array of spices, Mexican chocolate, corn husks, and other items. Although WPE picks up surplus food items from supermarkets and food distributors every day, it does not get everything needed for these food kits. For the Blessings Project, WPE needs the community's participation.

ARTHUR H. WEISS THE NEW GRAND MASTER

Worshipful Brother Arthur Harold Weiss was raised a Master Mason in Conejo Valley Lodge No. 807 in Thousand Oaks on January 28, 1986. He served as Master of the lodge in 1991 and 2003, and was presented the Hiram Award in 1997 for his distinguished service to the lodge.

Brother Weiss served the Grand Lodge as an Inspector, as Grand Marshal, and as Grand Chaplain. He served on the Leadership Development Committee, was a founding member of his Public Schools Advisory Council and has served on all five Constitutional Boards, including twelve years on the California Masonic Foundation, eight of them as President and Chairman of the Board.

In addition, Brother Weiss is active in the concordant and appendant bodies; including the Southern California Past Masters Association, the Los Angeles York Rite Bodies, Allied Masonic Degrees, Knight Masons, the Red Cross of Constantine and the Rosicrucians. He is a 32° Knight Commander of the Court of Honor in the Scottish Rite Valley of Los Angeles, a member of Al Malaikah Shriners, Hi Twelve and the National Sojourners. Brother Weiss is a member of the Order of the Eastern Star, served as Worthy Grand Patron of the Grand Chapter of California and is a General Grand Chapter Committee member.

Brother Weiss received a Bachelor of Science in Aeronautical Engineering in 1973 from Purdue University. He enjoyed a 42-year career in aerospace and defense at Rocketdyne, where he was part of the Space Shuttle Main Engine development team, led development of the RS-68 booster engine flying on the Delta IV, and propulsion for missiles currently deployed by the U.S. He was Executive Director of Missile Defense and of Advanced Programs prior to his retirement in 2015. He continues to consult and started an executive consulting firm.

Art and his wife, Barbara, live in Newbury Park and have one married daughter.
